REGULATIONS GOVERNING CREDIT BASED SEMESTER SCHEME

The Salient Features of the Credit Based Semester Scheme:

Each course shall carry certain number of credits. Credits normally represent the weightage of a course and decide function of teaching, learning and evaluation strategies such as number of contact hours, the course content, teaching methodology, learning expectations, maximum marks etc. In the proposed programmes in general, 2 hours of instructions per week in a semester is assigned one credit. In terms of evaluation, one credit is equivalent to 50 marks in a semester. On this basis, a three-year degree programme will have a maximum of 100 credits. The other features of the Credit Based Semester Scheme are:

- The degree programmes are structured on semester basis.
- The relative importance of subjects of study and activities are quantified in terms of credits and also their overall relative importance.
- The subjects of study include foundation courses, general studies and interdisciplinary subjects.
- The programme permits horizontal mobility in course selections.
- The students are required to take part in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities and their participation is compulsory as a part of the credit based system.
- The curricula and question papers are unitized.
- The declaration of results is based on the aggregated percentage of marks obtained as well as on Grade Point Average earned.

Duration of the Programmes

The duration of Bachelor Degree programmes shall extend over six semesters (three academic years) of 16 weeks each.

<p>A candidate shall register for all the papers of a semester when he / she appears for the examination of that semester for the first time.</p>		

Conduct of Examinations

There shall be Theory examinations at the end of each semester, ordinarily during October / November for odd semester and during April / May for even semesters, as prescribed in the Scheme of Examinations.

Minimum for a Pass

No candidate shall be declared to have passed the Semester Examination as the case may be under Group I / Group II / Group III (except in Co- and Extra curricular activities) unless he / she obtains not less than 35% marks in written examination and 35% marks in the aggregate of written examination and internal assessment put together in each of the subjects.

If a candidate fails in any subject, he / she shall appear for that subject only at any subsequent regular examination, within the maximum period prescribed for completing the programme. He / she must obtain the minimum marks for a pass in that subject as stated above.

Carry Over

A candidate who fails in a lower semester examination may go to the higher semester till final semester.

Classification of successful candidates

The results of successful candidates at the end of VI semester shall be classified on the basis of aggregate marks obtained in all the six semesters and the aggregate Grade Point Average (GPA).

Declaration of Class is on the basis of percentage of Aggregate Marks

First Class with Distinction	70% and above
First Class	60% and above but less than 70%
High Second Class	55% and above but less than 60%
Second Class	50% and above but less than 55%
Pass	35% and above but less than 50%

Each semester result shall also be declared in terms of grades. An eight point grading system, which is based on the actual absolute marks scored and alpha-sign grade as described below shall be adopted.

- The candidates who pass all the semester examinations in the first attempt in three years are eligible for ranks provided they secure 60% and above marks or at least an A grade.

- The results of the candidates who have passed the VI semester examination but not passed the lower semester examinations shall be declared as NCL (Not Completed Lower semester examinations). Such Candidates shall be eligible for the degree only after the completion of all previous semester examinations. A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible for only class and not for ranking

ATTENDANCE REGULATIONS

Rules and Regulation Related to Conduct and Behaviour

1. The college lays utmost stress on the formation of sound character and conduct. Violation of the same will be taken seriously.
2. A Student has to seek permission of the principal before absenting from internal assessment examination. Only on medical ground permission can be given for re - test. In such cases proper medical certificate should be submitted.
3. Good conduct and sufficient percentage of attendance are the requirements to appear for University examination.
4. Willful damage of property, books, furniture, water, and electricity installation will be fined. Such loss/ damage will have to be made good by the student concerned or by all the students of the class concerned as the case may be. The decision of the Principal is final in these matters.
5. Use of tobacco, alcohol and drugs in any form is forbidden. Students violating these rules are liable to face severe punishment.
6. Maintain cleanliness inside as well as outside the classroom.
7. No student of the college shall be a member of any organization, which will harm the interest of the institution and retard studies.
8. Irregularity in attendance, absenteeism, deliberate argument with lecturers, indiscipline, insubordination are liable for punishment.
9. Acts of indiscipline will be punished. Punishment may be in the form of fine, cancellation of scholarship or dismissal of the student. The principal may even refuse to give conduct / character certificate or may give an "Unsatisfactory conduct" certificate.
10. The rules pertaining to acts of indiscipline prescribed by the University will be displayed in the notice board from time to time.
11. Every student is given an identity card. It will have the photograph of the student. It will be attested by the principal. Identity card should be produced in the library, examination hall and in the office whenever authorities demand.
12. Students shall not invite any outsider to any college function without the prior permission of the principal.
13. Mobile phones should not be brought to the college as per University rules.
14. Scholarships and fee concessions are available to students according to Government rules. All scholarships and fee concessions are subject to satisfactory progress, conduct and attendance.
15. Loitering in the corridor/ squatting on the compound wall is forbidden.
16. Students who drive vehicle should possess valid driving licence & insurance. Avoid the use of noisy silencers in your vehicles.
17. As per section 116 of Karnataka Education Act ragging is prohibited.
18. It is mandatory to follow the **dress code** as prescribed by the college.

Subject : Supreme Court of India Orders - Curbing Ragging in Educational Institutions.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to say that the Hon. Supreme Court of India in SLP (C) No. 24295/2004 in the matter of University of Kerala v/s Council of principals, Colleges of Kerala and others, the Apex Court has expressed displeasure on the incidents in educational institutions.

(2) It may also be stated that the Report of the Raghavan Committee constituted as per directions of the Supreme Court of India to give suggestions on means of prevention of ragging in educational institutions, is already posted on UGC web site www.ugc.ac.in. The prescribed format for compliance report already circulated vide UGC office letter of even number dated 20th November, 2007.

(3) It has been impressed upon by the Hon. Supreme Court of India that henceforth in every prospectus relating to admission of the students in any educational institution, it shall be clearly stated that if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the student concerned shall be given liberty to explain and **if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the institution.**

(4) It is requested that necessary action may be taken in the light of the orders of the Hon. Supreme Court of India. This may also be brought to the notice of the colleges affiliated to your university.

(5) Action taken report in this regard may please be sent to this office early.
